Small, Jr. Keynote Lecture. This year's conference will be held on Friday, February 25, 2011 in Chapel Hill, North Carolina. The theme of the conference is **"The Promise of Health Equity: Advancing the Discussion to Eliminate Disparities in the 21st Century."** The conference will feature Bonnie M. Duran, Dr.P.H., Associate Professor in the Department of Health Services at the University of Washington School of Public Health. Dr. Duran is Director of the Center for Indigenous Health Research and a founding member of the International Network for Indigenous Health Knowledge and Development, an international assembly dedicated to improving the health of indigenous peoples in Australia, New Zealand, Canada and the United States through indigenous and community-led research, health services and workforce development. Dr. Duran's keynote lecture will be broadcast online at 2 p.m. ET
