The question of the Howard University issue was raised. After some discussion, a motion was accepted that the caucas would take a position in favor of the establishment of a school of Public Health in a predominantly Black instituation. This stand is to be operationalized by the presentation of a resolution from the Caucas to be presented to the student committee of the BCHW at the APHA meeting in Miami. C. Jenkins and D.
