Some of the programs which were developed during this time include: (1) Public Service Careers; (2) Cooperative Education; (3) Minority Consultation and Contracting; (4) Employee-Management Communication Workshops; and (5) Others. Supervised a full-time staff of three, a summer staff of four and provided general direction for seventy employees who were involved in the EEO program on a part-time basis.
